



- Youth Turned 18 – Needs Youth Protection Training, Criminal Background Check, and Application


Stage 2 - Internet Recharter

1. Update/Add/Remove members from roster
2. Re-check and verify YPT training
3. Finalize membership inventory/fall recruitment
4. Collect fees & submit roster
5. Member of key 3 approves

Stage 3 - Council Process

1. Council receives recharter
2. Validates recharter
3. Unit resolve defects or missing paperwork
4. Unit verifies My.Scouting roster

November Safety Moment



Make upcoming outdoor, winter scout experiences fun and safe with this safety moment.

Beyond camping, a number of cold-weather activities present challenges to Scouts and leaders, such as alpine or cross-country skiing, ice skating, sledding, ice fishing, and snowshoeing. Essential ingredients for fun include skill training and an awareness of the hazards unique to these activities.

KEY POINTS

1. Activities should be supervised by mature and conscientious adults.
2. Participants should be aware of the potential dangers of any winter sport, and leaders should stress incident prevention by emphasizing proper technique.
3. Help participants understand the need for using appropriate personal protective equipment such as helmets.
4. Winter sports are more physically demanding. Leaders and youth should be physically fit and capable to participate.
5. Be sure equipment fits each person properly.
6. During sledding, make sure the hill is safe and free of obstacles. Keep sledding paths and participant return paths separate from each other.
7. Talk about and gain support for the basic rules for the activity ... before it begins.




MiniGolf

Either on location of your pack meetings or around town


If you can tie the location or “hint” based on the Scout Law, the better - i.e., Trustworthy can be something related to the police department/fire department (we take care of community and wear a badge) or (we have a big red truck that makes lots of noise).

We did this years ago for the soccer team and had people stationed at the location to hand out the next clue. Some of the businesses also got into with handing out the next “clue”. Lots of fun for kids and adults.





Holiday Orange Coal Cakes

Cooking a cake on coals is a snap when you use a hollowed-out orange peel instead of a pan.

INGREDIENTS:

1. 1 8 oz. box Jiffy yellow cake mix
2. 1 egg
3. 1/2 cup water
4. 6 large, thick-skinned oranges

1.) Combine cake mix, egg and water. 2.) Cut a small “lid” in the top of each of six big navel oranges and scooped out the insides (can eat separately), just like carving a pumpkin. 3.) Pour cake batter into the gutted oranges, each about two-thirds full. 4.) Pop the “lids” back on the oranges, wrap them in heavy foil, and set them on the coals for about 20 minutes, turning often.


