

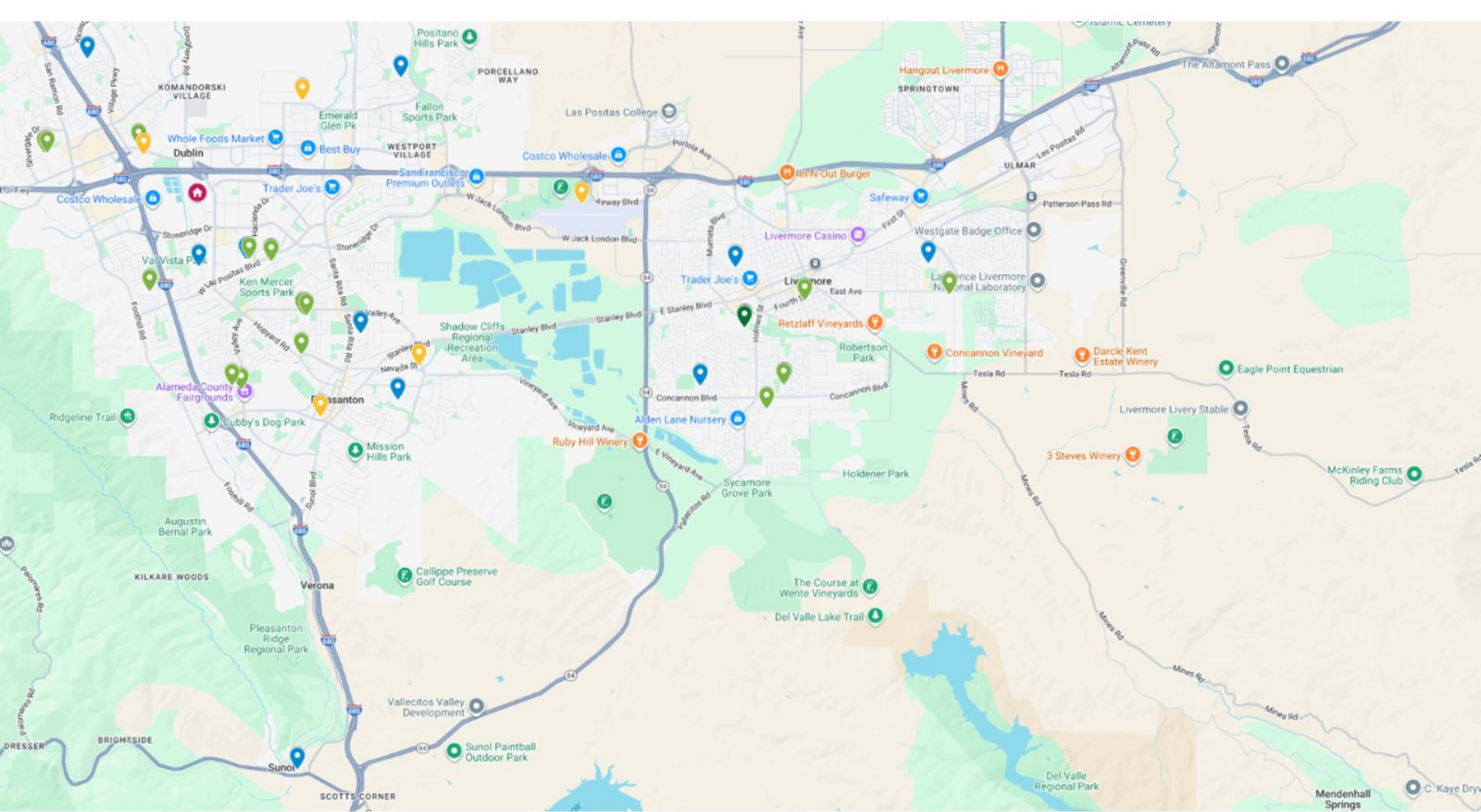

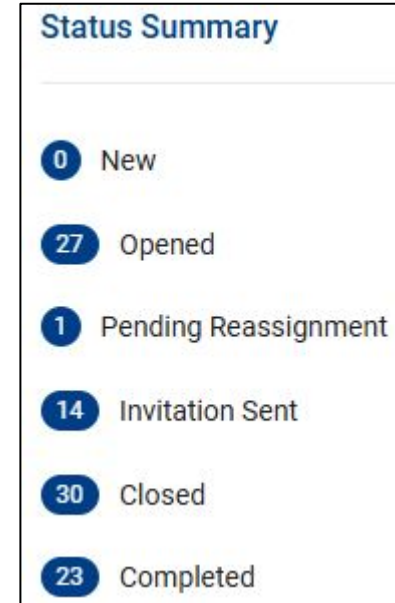

Accessing Your Unit Account

1. Customer's will log into their account ([click here](#) to see help videos) and then select their unit. A common step users miss is selecting their unit first from the drop down before clicking "View Activity".
2. Once the unit is selected, click "View Activity" then a page will appear where you can see the units Scouting Event registrations, camp reservations, and **Units Funds & Spending**. Here they can see past UDA transactions.
 - a. If they click the row, they can see more information about the transaction. If they are the controller, they'll see a button where they can deposit money to UDA, and a button where they can manage their trusted people. If they are not the controller, they will not see the second button.
3. **Deposit To UDA**. If they click this button, a page will appear where they can enter the amount they want to pay. After that, click "Process Payment" and they can enter their payment information.
4. **Manage Trusted People**. If the controller clicks this button, a page will appear where they can add / update / remove trusted people to the unit.
 - a. To add a new trusted person, click the button, then enter their information. Once they save, the person will be added to the unit and they will have access to the unit's roster, unit funds and spending tab, etc. They'll also be added to the Accounting / Administration / Units / Manage Units page.
 - b. To edit a trusted person, click the pencil next to their name. To remove a trusted person, click the red dash.

Managing Your Unit Account

1. **How To Add / Remove A Trusted Person**
 - a. If a unit calls you and needs a trusted person added or removed, go to the Accounting / Administration / Units / Manage Units page. Find the unit, then click the pencil next to their name.

The Life Skills Badge helps Scouts develop a variety of practical skills that are essential for independent living and personal growth.

Requirements Include:

- Describe the steps to make a doctor's appointment.
- Explain the steps required to do laundry. With your parent or guardian's permission, wash and dry one load of laundry.
- **Demonstrate your knowledge of sewing by sewing a patch or button on a shirt or pair of pants.**
- Describe how a credit card works, the reasons to get a credit card, the costs you may incur by using a credit card, and how to use a credit card effectively.
- Demonstrate how to properly introduce yourself in a social situation.
- Create a resume and review it with your counselor.
- **Explain what to do if you are involved in a car accident.**

Sewing & Needlework

In this badge, you will investigate several types of sewing and needlework. You will learn basic hand and machine sewing skills and make several small, practical projects using your new skills!

Requirements Include:

- Assemble a basic sewing and repair kit and explain the purpose of each item.
- Thread a needle and tie a quilter's or tailor's knot in a piece of fabric.
- Sew a button onto an item.
- Sew a patch on your uniform or other fabric using a whip stitch.
- **Visit a quilt or textile arts show or museum display either in-person or virtually. Explain to your counselor how they were created.**
- Provide a brief overview of the evolution of the sewing machine

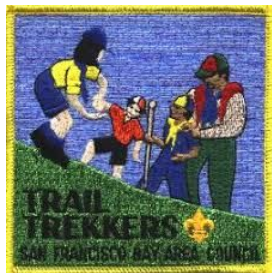

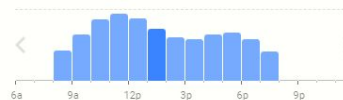

How Often do you meet?
